this for Mardi Gras, but it is a banquet setting and not a "lounge" setting like Lone Wolf. The Elks barroom is just that, with people walking up to the bar all the time, disrupting the jazz performance.

The Lodge is not set up well for restaurant-style dining. It does not have multiple menu items to choose from like Lone Wolf. Even if the Elks served a limited menu the choices are limited, unlike Lone Wolf's extensive menu. I believe table service from the Elks would not be as adequate as the service at Lone Wolf. A buffet style at the Elks would not be acceptable because of the serving chaos and the disruption of the performance. I really don't believe the Elks location will create any additional venue participation from FOJ members.
