Condolences to family and friends of Eddie Sheldrake on his passing in May at age 98. He was very supportive of Friends of Jazz.

Eddie Sheldrake served in the US Navy during World War II. After the Navy, he attended UCLA where he became a standout basketball player under the legendary John Wooden. He was later inducted into the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame; and he earned a degree in education.

In 1965, Eddie and his brother, Donald, opened the first free-standing Kentucky Fried Chicken franchise in California. What started as a single KFC in Belmont Shore grew into a thriving enterprise. In 1968, they founded Polly's Pies—a warm, welcoming restaurant rooted in family, tradition, great food and, of course, great pie. Eddie had a lifelong belief in education, fairness, and giving people a chance, One of the significant contributions he made was his support for music programs, a tradition we continue to uphold. All in all, he was a good guy who helped a lot of people.

A memorial service was held July 19 in Fullerton. In his memory, the family encourages you to support a charity of your choice that helps those in need—an act of generosity he'd quietly admire, right before telling you how to improve your business. . .or fix your free throw.
